

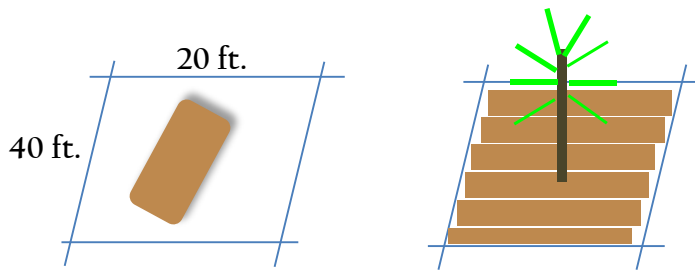

Seedling Tree or Shrub Survival Tips

Erosion Control Techniques

Three tactics to reduce soil erosion and increase water absorption.



Use one (~74lb.)
bail per plot

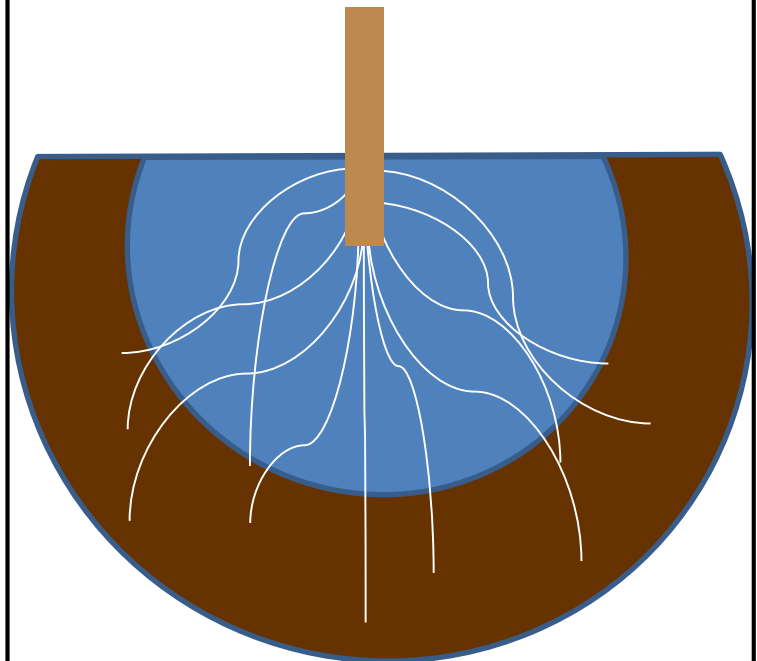
Spread the straw
evenly over the soil

Log erosion barrier or contour log terrace
orientation. Place logs perpendicular to the
flow of water.

Proper Watering Methods

Water low and slow around the dripline or root zone
of the seedling (~1 – 1.5 gal.) 1 times per week from
April to mid October to ensure healthy root growth.



About the CSFS Seedling Tree Program

The Colorado State Forest Service tree program enables farmers, ranchers, and landowners to obtain trees at nominal cost. The program's aim is to encourage landowners to plant trees and shrubs to be grown for conservation benefits. Ornamental qualities such as color and degree of fruit production are not guaranteed.

Conditions of Sale: (1) Nursery stock is to be used for conservation purposes only. (2) Payment must accompany order: no trees will be reserved until payment has been received. (3) Trees are living organisms that require care: there can be no guarantee of survival. (4) All orders are final: no cancellation or refunds. (5) In the event that trees ordered are unavailable, a refund may be offered unless a substitute species can be arranged.

| SURVIVAL ACCESSORIES |

Synthetic Polymer

Polymer is beneficial when used as a root-dip for bare root stock during the planting process. It also significantly increases first year survival when mixed with the back-fill soil at the rate of approximately one cup of the hydrated polymer per tree or shrub. When hydrated, a **1/4 pound bag will service 80-100 trees**.

Fertilizer Tablets (20 – 10 – 5, 10 grams)

The fertilizer tablets are slow release tablets that should last up to three years depending moisture content. Each seedling needs one tablet at planting time.

Tree Guards

Tree guards are photodegradable plastic mesh tubes (4in. X 24 in.). They help protect seedlings from deer and various surface rodents. Two 36" bamboo stakes are recommended to hold each guard in place.



Shingles/Shades for Shade & Wind Protection

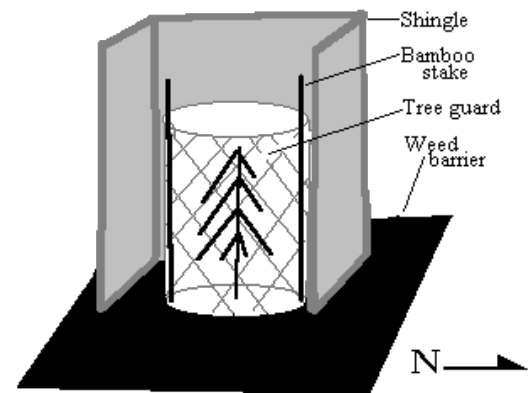
Conifers planted on exposed sites are extremely susceptible to sun-scald and moisture loss especially on dry, windy days. Shingles and shades reduce this stress. It takes approximately two bundles of shingles or 30 bundle of shades to shade one box (30 trees). They should be placed on the north, west, and south sides of each seedling.

Weed Barriers

This product is a woven polypropylene fabric which acts as artificial mulch to reduce soil moisture loss. It is porous, thus allowing water and snow to seep through the material. Weed barrier also eliminates weed and grass competition that can "choke out" seedlings.

Weed Barrier Rolls & Fabric Squares

Weed barrier is available in rolls 6' wide by 300' long or 4' x 4' squares with four hold-down staples.



Tentative Pickup Dates –Early April for Alamosa and late April for all other locations. Notification will be sent with exact dates and times via email to everyone who places an order. Plants can be picked up at the Alamosa, Cañon City, La Veta, and Woodland Park locations depending on the location you select.

Assistance for seedling selections and site planning specific to your property is available directly from Colorado State Forest Service personnel. Planting trees and shrubs in the Region takes special care. Survival accessories (tree guards, fertilizer, synthetic polymer, shingles and weed barrier) that can greatly increase survival rates are available.
